**Official By-Laws  
of the Maryland  
State Rifle & Pistol Association  
Revised July 8, 1989**

**PREAMBLE**

In accordance with the purposes and objectives of the National Rifle Association, the objectives of this association shall be to create a public sentiment for the encouragement of training in the use of firearms as a sport, as an essential contribution to National Security, and as maintenance of individual liberty and for personal defense.

The purpose of this organization will be to encourage proper organization, operation and administration of member clubs; to promote and coordinate statewide activities related to the ownership and use of firearms and to cooperate with other organizations in the conservation of natural resources within the State of Maryland and throughout the United States.

## NRA National Air Gun Championship

The 2009 Air Rifle Team representing Maryland (sponsored by MSRPA) at the NRA National Air Gun Championship at Camp Perry was composed of Katie Swan (NJROTC Seneca Valley), Quentin Sweetser (NJROTC Annapolis), Nathan Moy (NJROTC Annapolis), Jimmy Clark (NJROTC Linganore) and Daniel Bassett (NJROTC Linganore).

For Katie and Quentin, this was their second NRA national match since both went to Iowa last year. For Nathan, Jimmy and Daniel it was their first national match, which made them a bit nervous. All agreed that having a practice day on the electronic targets helped since they are used to shooting at paper targets. Equipment checks, registration and other events ran smoothly.

The team members were billeted in different locations. Some were as close as 100 yards from the range and had a breath taking view of Lake Erie. When we weren't shooting we attended some classes on collegiate shooting, shooting fitness and my shooting portfolio. The range was outstanding - a perfect range with all automated targets. I think the range and the system there were well thought out and the relays ran extremely smoothly.

Some of the comments from the kids:

**Nathan** - Probably the best range experience I've ever had. I didn't do my best at the competition but next year in the 2010 National Match in New Mexico I know I will do better.

**Quentin** - Overall Nationals this year was another great experience for me in my shooting career.

**Daniel** - This was a great opportunity for our team. To shoot at Camp Perry has been a dream come true for me. The NRA did a great job organizing everything. I can't wait to go to New Mexico next year!

# My Bisley Adventure

It all started when I was contacted last year by the NRA and invited to compete in the National Matches of the UK as a member of the Goodwill Randle Team. (I was eligible because I was a previous member of the Randle Team, which is chosen yearly at Camp Perry and consists of the top 10 women prone shooters.) The invitation caught my attention and even though I had not competed, or even shot, in over 30 years I wondered if I could make it happen. I decided if I could get everything together, equipment, rifle, ammo, place to practice, etc.---it was meant to be. Thanks to the members of Arundel Fish and Game, family, and friends who helped me along the way I ended up in Bisley, England in August of this year.

What a wonderful experience and adventure! I left the US not knowing anyone I was traveling with and not sure of what I would encounter. Admittedly I didn't shoot well but the friendships and knowledge I gained was immeasurable.

Once I got there it was amazing the people that remembered shooting with me and how friendly, encouraging, and supportive they were. I asked a multitude of questions about their equipment, sights, rifles, ammo, tubes, scopes, triggers, etc and they patiently answered and gave me advice. Lones Wigger, who I stood on the podium with at Camp Perry in 1971 even offered to let me come to the Olympic Training Center for coaching!



The Bisley Meeting had 800 competitors and the actual range used 150 firing points. It is famous for its wind and weather changes, which were a constant topic of conversation all week. The rain held off though, and we had sun most of the week, which was very unusual. The Meeting is run a little differently. There is

no prep period prior to commencing fire. The commands were (in a very Scottish accent) "settle down", "stand by" and then a long buzzer. After that you were good to fire and you had better be ready! Matches were numbered and called

competitions, each competition had numbered relays called "details", and targets were "cards". You could also enter "sticker" matches with names like "Flowers Trophy" and "Duchess of Kent" or "Junior Development Fund". You purchased the sticker (and the prices varied) and you could either shoot the detail or put the sticker on a target you were required

to fire for your aggregate. If you had good conditions you would see targets "wallpapered" with stickers anticipating a good score. It was a great way to raise money for the sport and special interests.

Upon returning I received an email from Lenore Lemanski, a member of the contingent that went with us and a great prone shooter who has been a member of the Randle Team several times. I think

what she wrote sums up my feelings. "Bisley was truly awesome—from the array of clubs and club houses on the complex, to the "village" of caravans (trailers), to the expansive range, to the wonderful social atmosphere. Bisley is something that a small bore shooter ought to experience at least once".

I am so grateful that I had this opportunity and I hope to continue to shoot ---Who knows--The Scots have a "meeting" in 2 years that I'd like to go to!

# PISTOLS AT CAMP PERRY 2009

Camp Perry 2009 was another a good year...actually, any time at Perry is a good. Attendance for the pistol championships was up from last year, which was promising, given the state of the economy and the price of fuel and housing. And, while weather is often a contributing factor to the Perry experience, this year saw very mild temperatures and very little rain though there. While challenges were encountered, the MSRPA Pistol Team had a good showing, both individually and collectively. And our new shirts and caps made us look like we knew what we were doing, fooling many of the less-informed competition.

Ten individuals represented the MSRPA at Camp Perry this year...Jeff Andrews, Mike Butterfield, Tim Caven, Ed Grove, John Hollingshead, Neil Kravitz, Dave Molofsky, Mike Sharp, Jack Snyder, and Tom Willats. In addition, Linda Newcomer, a longtime MSRPA Pistol Team member, volunteered as a line officer while recuperating from shoulder surgery. All of them have stories to tell...just ask them.

The pistol phase of Camp Perry began with the Small Arms Firing School (SAFS), a clinic to provide instruction and coaching in service pistol fundamentals to the novice competitor. New this year was a clinic offered by the U. S. Army Advanced Marksmanship Unit for experienced shooters, in lieu of attending the SAFS. It was an excellent presentation given by Staff Sergeants Henderson and Park...incidentally, you need to watch that Henderson fellow, as he managed to win just about everything at Perry that was shot using one hand.

Tuesday wrapped up the SAFS phase, and the NRA matches began. In all respects, John Hollingshead had a very good revolver day, shooting a 270-6X and finishing 24<sup>th</sup> out of 358 individuals in the Harry Reeves Match (for any-sight revolver), then backing that up by shooting a 267-5X and finishing 46<sup>th</sup> out of 353 individuals in the Distinguished Revolver Match (for .38 Special service revolvers). Tom Willats was close behind, firing a 267-4X and finishing 48<sup>th</sup> in the DR match.

Wednesday was the Preliminary Match, where we shoot all three pistols in a warm-up match. The only MSRPA individual who made the "winners" list was Tim Caven, who fired an 833-18X and finished 15<sup>th</sup> Expert.

Thursday saw the start of the National Championship Match, with the firing of the .22 phase. John Hollingshead had another good day, firing a 187-7X slow (6<sup>th</sup> Master),

a 200-11X timed fire (2<sup>nd</sup>), and a 198-6X rapid fire good enough for (8<sup>th</sup>). John's 872-37X aggregate saw him finish as 4<sup>th</sup> Master. Other highlights were Tom Willats' 186 5X slow fire (9<sup>th</sup>

Master) and Ed Groves' 198-3X rapid fire (9<sup>th</sup> Master).

Friday was the center fire match. Notable MSRPA performances were turned in by two Expert-class members, Tim Caven and Mike Sharp. Mike shot a 189-2X slow fire, finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> Expert, while Tim shot a 185-5X, finishing 7<sup>th</sup> Expert. Tim went on to shoot a 195-6X timed fire, finishing 15<sup>th</sup>, and a 193-10X rapid fire, finishing 10<sup>th</sup>. Tim's 854-26X aggregate saw him finish at 4<sup>th</sup> Expert, while Mike's 849-15X saw him finish 9<sup>th</sup>. Oh, remember that Hollingshead fellow? He shot a 289-5X national match course, finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> Master, and a 196-9X rapid fire, finishing 2<sup>nd</sup>...not too shabby.

Saturday was the last day of the NRA matches, when we all got to have fun with our .45s. John Hollingshead continued to shine by firing a 184-4X slow fire (7<sup>th</sup> Master) and a 197-8X timed fire (4<sup>th</sup>). John's 858-22X aggregate saw him finish in 7<sup>th</sup>. Trying to grab just a bit of the spotlight were Jeff Andrews' 185-5X slow fire (6<sup>th</sup> Master), Tim Caven's 281-5X national match course (16<sup>th</sup> Expert), and Mike Sharp's 196-5X timed fire (12<sup>th</sup> Expert).

Not surprisingly, John Hollingshead finished well in the Grand Aggregate, as his 2574-77X saw him finish up as 3<sup>rd</sup> Master. Did I mention that John's been shooting competitively for less than four years? John's performance is a testimonial to obtaining timely and experienced instruction and coaching, dedication, and effective practice. Good shooting John!

In the NRA team matches the MSRPA Pistol Teams did well. The four-man team shot in the State Association - Expert class and consisted of Mike Butterfield, Tim Caven, Ed Grove, and Dave Molofsky. Neil Kravitz was their captain, Ed Grove was the coach, and Mike Sharp was an alternate shooter. Their 1031-11X .22

score, shot in 25 to 35 mph sustained winds...some of the windiest conditions I've ever experienced 20 years at Perry ... had them finish in 12<sup>th</sup>. Their 1077-26X center fire score...yeah, they bettered their .22 score...had them finish 3<sup>rd</sup>. Their 1057-19X .45 score had them finish 8<sup>th</sup>, while their 3165-56X grand aggregate also was good for 8<sup>th</sup>.

The MSRPA also fielded a two-man team, consisting of Jeff Andrews and Tom Willats. This was a new event; unfortunately, only 20 teams were entered in this inaugural match. Their 512-7X .22 total had them finish 13<sup>th</sup>...remember the wind? Their 513-5X center fire was also good for 13<sup>th</sup>, but they improved a good bit by firing a 560-17X in the .45 match, which was good enough for 6<sup>th</sup>. Their 1585-29X aggregate had them finish 12<sup>th</sup>, but there was an interesting twist to this team match, as it was an open match. In other words, all teams shot against each other regardless of their NRA classification. Also of interest is the fact that seven of the 12 teams who finished ahead of them were military, police, or commercially supported.

Sunday was the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) matches, where everything is fired with service pistols. It was also our last day at Perry...can you hear the sighs? First match of the

day was the President's 100. Two MSRPA members made this year's selection...Ed Grove finished 27<sup>th</sup> with a 368-11X and Tom Willats finished 56<sup>th</sup> with a 359-7X. Next up was the National Trophy Individual (NTI) match; at the local level that's known as the EIC (Excellence in Competition). Ed Grove distinguished himself again, no pun intended, by shooting a 276-6X and finishing in 40<sup>th</sup> place out of 527 competitors. The final

match was the National Trophy Team (NTT) match. This years MSRPA team consisted of Ed Grove, John Hollingshead, Jack Snyder, and Tom Willats, with Jeff Andrews as the captain and Ed Grove as the coach. Unfortunately, we didn't fare well once the smoke cleared, finishing 20<sup>th</sup> out of the 25 teams who competed. Oh well, there's always next year.

## CAMP PERRY RIFLE REPORT—009

The Maryland State Rifle Team had a smaller contingent attending the National Matches this year, than in years past. The reduced numbers were mostly due to the failing economy that we've all experienced in one form or another. Even so, we had 24 members who made the trek.

The National Rifle Championships consist of a number of individual and team matches fired under the auspices of the Director of the Civilian Marksmanship Program.

The principal matches are the President's Trophy Match, the National Individual Trophy Match, the National Trophy Team Match and the National Trophy Infantry Team Match. There are also several additional matches including the newly established National Trophy Junior Team Match (for junior 2-person teams), the Springfield Match (for military bolt action rifles), the vintage Rifle Match (for military bolt action rifles other than the Springfield), and the Garand Match. Also held was the Small Arms Firing School hosted by the Army Marksmanship Unit and the Junior Highpower Clinic hosted by the Marine Corps Shooting Team.

The first match of the week is the coveted President's Match. The top 100 finishers are awarded the "President's Hundred" designation.

This is the only match each year where that distinction can be achieved.

This year Richard Kussman and Gregory Blackstock made the cut. Please be sure to congratulate them if you see them on the range or anywhere else.

On Tuesday, the National Trophy Individual (NTI) Match

was fired. This is an Excellence-in-Competition Match in that points can be earned for the Distinguished Rifleman Badge. The top 10% of non-distinguished shooters are awarded points. In that top 10%, the top 1/6<sup>th</sup> earn gold medals, the next 1/3<sup>rd</sup> earn silver medals and the remaining half earn bronze medals. Distinguished shooters earn medals based on where they are relative to the non-distinguished shooters in the final standings. James Bowen, Rich Kussman, and Greg Blackstock, who are all Distinguished Riflemen, won gold medals, and Bob RaVell, Jr.

won a bronze and his first 10 points toward Distinguished. CDR Joe Ignacio, a frequent competitor at Fort Meade with the Maryland Rifle Team, also won points toward his Distinguished Award with the Coast Guard. Several others were just a few points out and they will be "in the hunt" in future years. Another side note is that Michael Merkle in his first year at Camp Perry was the high scoring junior from Maryland in the NTI.

Wednesday the wind came up and was blowing at 15-20 mph. This made the offhand phase of the inaugural National Trophy Junior Team Match very challenging, to say the least. We fielded two teams. The Red Team of Brett RaVell and Adam Maurer finished 46<sup>th</sup>; the Blue Team of Sean Magee and Michael Merkle finished 62<sup>nd</sup>. There were a total of 88 teams competing, so it was quite a large match.

For the first time in the last 7 years we fielded only one team in the National

Any highpower rifle competitor in Maryland can be part of the State Rifle Team. All it takes is showing up with an interest in shooting. The Rifle Team has organized practices and shoots in Team Matches prior to the Nationals for training. We would like to get the participation back up to over 40 shooters. Trophy Team (NTT) match. Firing members were James Bowen, Dan Pekala, Rich Kussman, Dave Griffith, Larry Moreland and Bob RaVell. We finished 15<sup>th</sup> among the civilian teams and 24<sup>th</sup> overall.

On Friday the fun began. The National Infantry Trophy Team (NITT) Match is fired at 600, 500, 300 and 200 yards. Each team is given 384 rounds of ammunition and the six-man squad must engage 8 targets at each yardline. At each yardline, the team has 50 seconds to fire as many shots as they can or want. This year's firing members were James Bowen, Rich Kussman, Adam Maurer, Bob RaVell, Glenn Reisinger and Wally Chance with Team Captain Larry Moreland and Coach Greg Blackstock. We beat both the Marine Corps Team and the All-Guard team. We were quite pleased with that outcome. In the final standings we were 10<sup>th</sup> out of the 30 civilian teams and 14<sup>th</sup> out of 37 teams. A junior team from California was the overall winner of the NITT. That is the first time ever that a junior team has won all the marbles.



## RaVell and Maurer win Bronze in Whistler Boy Match

**B**rett RaVell and Adam Maurer won Bronze Medallions for placing in the top 20 Whistler Boy Team Match. This is an NRA match that was formerly conducted in the middle of the National Matches. It was moved to the beginning of NRA week this year. Similar to the National Trophy Junior Team Match, this is a two-person team match. Also similar to the National Trophy Match, the wind was blowing very hard and it was almost impossible to shoot decent offhand scores.

Once they got off their hind legs, the guys did great and the proof is in the results. If you see these guys around the range, be sure to congratulate them!

## James Bowen Awarded Distinguished Rifleman Badge

James Bowen of Owings Mills was awarded the Distinguished Rifleman Badge at a ceremony at Camp Perry, Ohio.

The Distinguished Rifleman Badge is earned by amassing points in specified matches conducted by the Civilian Marksmanship Program or the military services. These matches are called Excellence-in-Competition Matches or more commonly, Leg Matches. A shooter can only participate in 4 Leg Matches in any calendar year and one of these must be the National Matches. In each match, the top 10% of all shooters who have not yet achieved their distinguished rank are awarded points. The top 10% get either 6, 8 or 10 points toward their Badge. When they have earned 30 points and at least one "leg" is either an 8 or 10 pointer, they are awarded the Distinguished Rifleman Badge. All civilians earn 10 points at the National Matches, no matter where they finish in the 10%.

James had a very good year, including winning a Leg Match in Cumberland, MD and a Gold Daniel Boone Medal in the National Trophy Match. Our heartiest "Well Done" goes out to James, our newest Distinguished Rifleman in Maryland.

## Laughlan Repeats Grand Senior Service Rifle Championship

Jim Laughland defended his Grand Senior Service Rifle Championship (Grand Seniors are shooter 70 years old or older) with a come-from-behind win on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of shooting at Camp Perry. Down by as many as 12 points earlier, going into the fourth and final day of competition, Laughland had closed the gap to only 4 points. He knew that he had to build a lead in the standing event and then stay close to his competition for the remainder of the day in order to defend his title.

The weather was perfect with little wind, bright skies and the sun at 2 o'clock. Laughland reported that the targets appeared a little dark but that he could still get a good sight picture.

The final scores were Laughland: 2228-44x and his competition had 2199-37x, winning Jim Laughland the Grand Senior Service Rifle Championship for the second time in 2 years.
